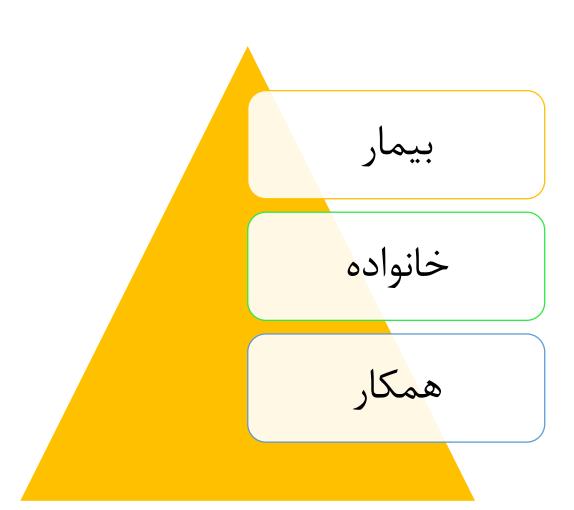

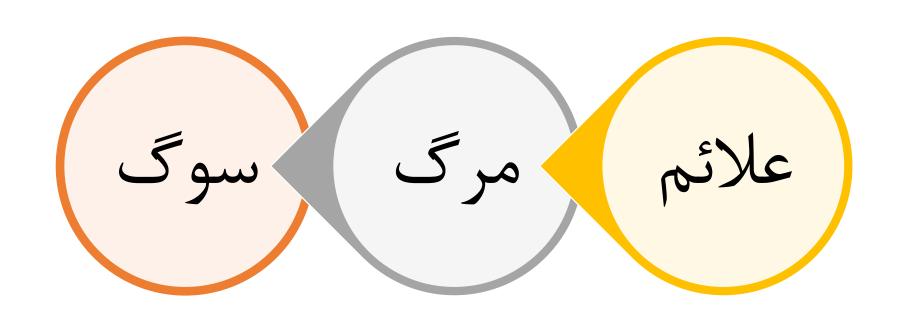

Role of the Nurse on the Interdisciplinary Team
